Community Hedging for wildlife - Suffolk Wildlife , Foxburrow Farm

One day course which focused on maintenance rather than just planting

Information included -

History of hedging

Wildlife benefiting from variety of species

Correct maintenance ensures healthy hedges for wildlife.

Flailing, cheapest and most used option. Works well if carried out correctly including not left too long a period which then results in a rather butchered look.

Coppicing and hedge layering less likely as labour intensive therefore costly.

Maintenance carried out from 1st October

Species identified and advised on best to plant
