Yellow Lines

Do you get annoyed when you see people parking on double yellow lines and wonder whether there is anything you can do to encourage the authorities to address the problem? East Suffolk Council administers civil parking enforcement on behalf of Suffolk County Council. This means they can issue Penalty Charge Notices (PCNs) if their patrols identify drivers failing to observe the regulations. You can help them by reporting incidents. This will help them to identify hotspots and allocate their patrols accordingly. To lodge a report, make a note of the details of the offending vehicle and submit the details online to [Civil parking enforcement » East Suffolk Council](#) and click on the link 'To report a Suspected Parking Contravention'

One location where parking on the double yellow lines happens all too often is at the junction of Church Lane and the High Road, this makes it very difficult for Church Lane residents to join the High Road safely. The Parish Council has asked Suffolk County Council to consider repainting the yellow lines and to consider extending the lines further along the High Road.

Mill Lane

As you will know, there are temporary traffic lights in place on the High Road and at the top of Mill Lane. This means that drivers joining the High Rd at the Mill Lane junction often have to wait for a minute or two. This isn't a problem in itself, but there can be real difficulties if other drivers have parked at the top of Mill Lane, opposite the Methodist Church car park. When this happens traffic cannot easily turn into Mill Lane and what might have been a momentary delay turns into a major blockage so please
